First you may be wondering, “What is the MOMS Club®?”

The MOMS Club® is an acronym for Mothers offering Mothers Support. It is an international non-profit organization specifically for stay-at-home mothers. We include mothers of all ages, as well as those who work outside of the home or part-time. We strive to have fun, while supporting each other in the wonderful, but sometimes difficult task of raising our children. To meet this goal, we have meetings and activities throughout each month, giving all our members the opportunity to grow and learn as parents and build lasting friendships.

The MOMS Club® was started in Simi Valley, CA in 1983. There are now over 2,000 chapters nationwide. The Statesboro chapter is a new addition, founded in 2005.

The MOMS Club® plans monthly calendars full of events for mothers and their children. We also plan community service projects within our area to assist people in need. MOMS Club® members are not required to join any committees, clubs or participate in any activities. Each mom can decide how much or how little participation is best for her and her children.

At the MOMS Club®, we believe that being a mother should not isolate you. Children are welcome at all club functions. You do not have to bring them, but if you do, you are responsible for their safety and their behavior.
